The Islamic Calendar

In the past, Muslims would name each year after a major event that took place in it. For example, the year in which Abraha and his army came with their elephants to destroy the Ka'bah was known as the year of the elephants. People used to say: "This event took place so many years before the year of the elephants and that event took place so many years after the year of the elephants." Later on during the khilaafat of Hadhrat Umar (radiyallahu anhu), there was a need to have one standard Islamic calendar. The Sahaabah (radiyallahu anhum) agreed that the hijrah will be the starting point. Till today we use the hijri calendar.

What is Hijrah?

When the kuffaar of Makkah were troubling the Muslims and not allowing them to practice Islam freely, Allah Ta'ala commanded Nabi (sallallahu alayhi wasallam) to make hijrah (move) from Makkah Mukarramah to Madinah Munawwarah.

Hadhrat Abu-Bakr (radiyallahu anhu) accompanied Nabi (sallallahu alayhi

In Madinah Shareef the Muslims practiced Islam freely. As a result, their numbers increased and Islam grew stronger.


Islamic Year
