





- After many years, Hadhrat Aadam (alayhis salaam) passed away.
- The children of Hadhrat Aadam (alayhis salaam) were still living in this world.
- They were good people and worshipped Allah Ta'ala alone.

- He did not want them to be good people and go to Jannah.
- He wanted them to make Allah angry and then Allah will send them to Jahannam.

- His name was Hadhrat Nooh (alayhis salaam).
- Allah Ta'ala made him a Nabi to guide the people.
- Hadhrat Nooh (alayhis salaam) explained to the people that what they were doing was wrong.
- He told them to leave out worshipping the idols and go back to worshipping Allah Ta'ala.
- But the people did not want to listen.
- Hadhrat Nooh (alayhis salaam) did not give up.
- He kept on calling the people to worship Allah Ta'ala for 950 years.



Lessons from the life of Hadhrat Nooh (alayhis salaam)

- Do not worship anything or anyone besides Allah Ta'ala.
- We must not make pictures or statues of anyone. For example, we must not take photographs of people, paint or draw pictures of people or animals. This will lead us to doing wrong and it makes Allah Ta'ala angry.
- Always listen to someone who is teaching us good like our Apa or Moulana in Madrasah.
- Do not laugh or make fun of your Apa, Moulana, any pious people and the Prophets.
- Be friends with good people. Do not be friends with people who make you do wrong things.
- We must not do anything that makes Allah Ta'ala angry such as fighting, lying, etc.
- If Allah Ta'ala is angry and punishes you, no one can save you. Remember Hadhrat Nooh's (alayhis salaam) son was drowned even though he was the son of a Nabi.
- Always try and be with those people who are poor and humble. Allah Ta'ala loves the poor people




