The people became very angry with Ibraaheem (alayhis salaam) for not worshipping their idols. He said to them, “How can I worship idols when they can neither help me nor harm me? Don't you people understand?”

The people were now very angry with him. They got together and planned, “How should we punish Ibraaheem for what he has done?”

The answer was, “Burn him and take revenge for your idols.” That was exactly what they did. They lit a huge fire and threw Hadhrat Ibraaheem (alayhis salaam)

into it. Who was going to help him? Off course, Allah Ta'ala who is An-Naasir helped Hadhrat Ibraaheem (alayhis salaam) and said to the fire, “O fire, become cool for Ibraaheem.” Immediately, the fire became cool and a place of comfort for Ibraaheem (alayhis salaam). Allah Ta'ala helped Hadhrat Ibraaheem (alayhis salaam) and the fire did not burn him.

(Rejecting all things of kufr)



3. When we read Kalimah Radd-e-Kufr, we are saying that we reject anything to do with kufr.
4. In this Kalimah, we are also asking Allah Ta'ala to protect us from kufr, shirk and all kinds of sins.
5. Every Muslim must learn Kalimah Radd-e-Kufr and read it daily before going to sleep.



6. Reading Kalimah Radd-e-Kufr helps to keep our Imaan strong and protects us from kufr and shirk.

Meaning of Kalimah Radd-e-Kufr

اللَّهُمَّ إِنِّي أَعُوذُ بِكَ مِنْ أَنْ أُشْرِكَ بِكَ شَيْئاً وَأَنَا أَعْلَمُ بِهِ

O Allah I ask You to protect me from joining any partner with You knowingly,

وَأَسْتَغْفِرُكَ لِمَا لَا أَعْلَمُ بِهِ

and I ask for Your forgiveness for what I do not know,

تُبْتُ عَنْهُ

I beg You to forgive me for what I do not know,

وَتَبَرَّأْتُ مِنَ الْكُفُرِ وَالشِّرْكِ وَالْمَعَاصِي كُلِّهَا

I free myself from disbelief, joining partners (with you) and from all types of sins.

أَسْلَمْتُ وَأَمَنْتُ وَأَقُولُ لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ مُحَمَّدٌ رَسُولُ اللَّهِ

I happily accept Your commands, bring Imaan (believe) in You and declare that: There is no God besides Allah Ta'ala and that Nabi Muhammad (sallallahu alayhi wasallam) is the messenger of Allah Ta'ala.


1. We are Muslims. We follow the religion of Islam.

The Ambiyaa (alayhimus salaam) are special men who were chosen and sent by Allah Ta'ala to guide people to the right path.

Singular: **Nabi**

Plural: **Ambiyaa**

1. The Ambiyaa (alayhimus salaam) are the best of Allah Ta'ala's creation.
2. It is compulsory for us to believe in all the Ambiyaa (alayhimus salaam).
3. Although we believe in all the Ambiyaa (alayhimus salaam), we only follow the shari'ah (laws) of our beloved Nabi Muhammad (sallallahu alayhi wasallam), who is the last Nabi of Allah Ta'ala.

Hadhrat Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) was a Nabi of Allah Ta'ala. Allah Ta'ala gave him lots of land, animals and money. He was also blessed with a lovely family with fourteen beautiful children. He made shukr (was thankful) to Allah Ta'ala for all these bounties. He never became proud or arrogant because he knew that all these favours are a gift from Allah Ta'ala.

One day, Allah Ta'ala tested Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam). First, his land, animals, and money were taken away. Then, all his children passed away. Later on, he became very sick.

Many years passed like this in difficulty and sickness but Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) never ever

complained about his condition. He made sabr (was patient) because he knew that all conditions- good and bad- only come from Allah Ta’ala (Taqdeer).

Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) always made dua to Allah Ta’ala to help him. He understood that Allah Ta’ala is Al-Aleem, The All-Knowing; As-Samee, The All-Hearing and An-Naasir, The Helper. Allah Ta’ala had full knowledge of his condition and it was only Allah Ta’ala who could take him out of these difficulties.

After many years, one day, Allah Ta’ala caused a spring of water to gush from the ground. He told Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) to wash his body with the water and to drink from it also. Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) did as Allah Ta’ala commanded him and immediately a miracle happened - all his sickness went away! He became strong and healthy again. Allah Ta’ala gave him his wealth back and blessed him with many more beautiful children.

Allah Ta’ala was very happy with the way Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam) made shukar in times of happiness and sabr in times of difficulty and sickness.

After all, Allah Ta'ala is Al-Qaadir, The Most-Powerful. Allah Ta'ala has full power and control over everything.

Lessons learnt from the Story of Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam):

- **Everything is from Allah Ta'ala:** All the blessings we enjoy came from Allah Ta'ala alone. He can take them away from us whenever He wishes.
- **Allah Ta'ala is An Naasir (The Helper):** Only Allah Ta'ala can help us when we are in difficulty.
- **Allah Ta'ala hears our duas.** He is As-Samee' (The All-Hearing). We must make dua to Allah Ta'ala to help us.
- **Allah Ta'ala is All-Powerful:** Through a miracle he cured Nabi Ayyoob (alayhis salaam). Nothing is too hard for Allah Ta'ala
- **We should never lose hope in Allah Ta'ala.** A true Muslim always believes that Allah Ta'ala's plan is the best plan.

Being kind to animals, helping people, staying clean and smiling are all part of the beautiful Sunnah of Rasulullah ﷺ.


We should follow the Sunnah in everything we do.

Yaumil Aakhiri means the last day. It is also known as the day of Qiyaamah. On this day, the entire world will come to an end, people will be brought back to life and everyone will have to answer for their actions.

Qiyaamah will take place on a Friday, but only Allah Ta'ala knows the exact date of Qiyaamah.

First Blowing:

1. Allah Ta'ala will command Hadhrat Israafeel (alayhis salaam) to blow the Soor (trumpet).
2. The sound of the trumpet will be very loud and frightening.

3. It will cause every living person and creature to die.
4. The earth will start to shake and the mountains will float in the air like cotton wool.

6. At this time, only Allah Ta'ala will be alive.

Second Blowing:

1. After some time, Allah Ta'ala will command Hadhrat Israafeel (alayhis salaam) to blow the soor for the second time.
2. Everything will again come back to life.
3. People will start to come out of their graves.
4. They will be shocked and frightened, running in all directions, not knowing what is happening.
5. The first person to come out from the grave will be our beloved Nabi Muhammad (sallallahu alayhi wasallam).

1. The day of Qiyaamah is a very frightening day. Everybody will be worried about themselves. A person will run away from his own brother, mother, father, wife and child.
2. The sun will be just above our heads and it will be boiling hot. There will be no shade at all for anyone. People will be drowning in their own sweat.
3. The only shade on that day will be the shade under the throne of Allah Ta'ala. Nobody will be allowed to sit in this shade except those whom Allah Ta'ala allows. These people will have no fear

and no worry. They will be treated with great honour and respect.

4. Some of the special people who will be under the shade of the throne of Allah Ta’ala will be:

- Young boys and girls who grow-up obeying Allah Ta’ala.
- Those men who always go to the Masjid and read their five times salaah in the Masjid.
- Those people who help the poor and needy quietly, only to make Allah Ta’ala happy.
- Those people who make the zikr of Allah Ta’ala all alone and tears flow from their eyes.
- A just ruler (who is fair with all his people).
- Those people who teach the Qur-aan Shareef to Muslim children.
- Those children who learn the Qur-aan Shareef when they are small and continue to read it when they grow up.

We must always make dua to Allah Ta’ala to make us from those special people on the day of
